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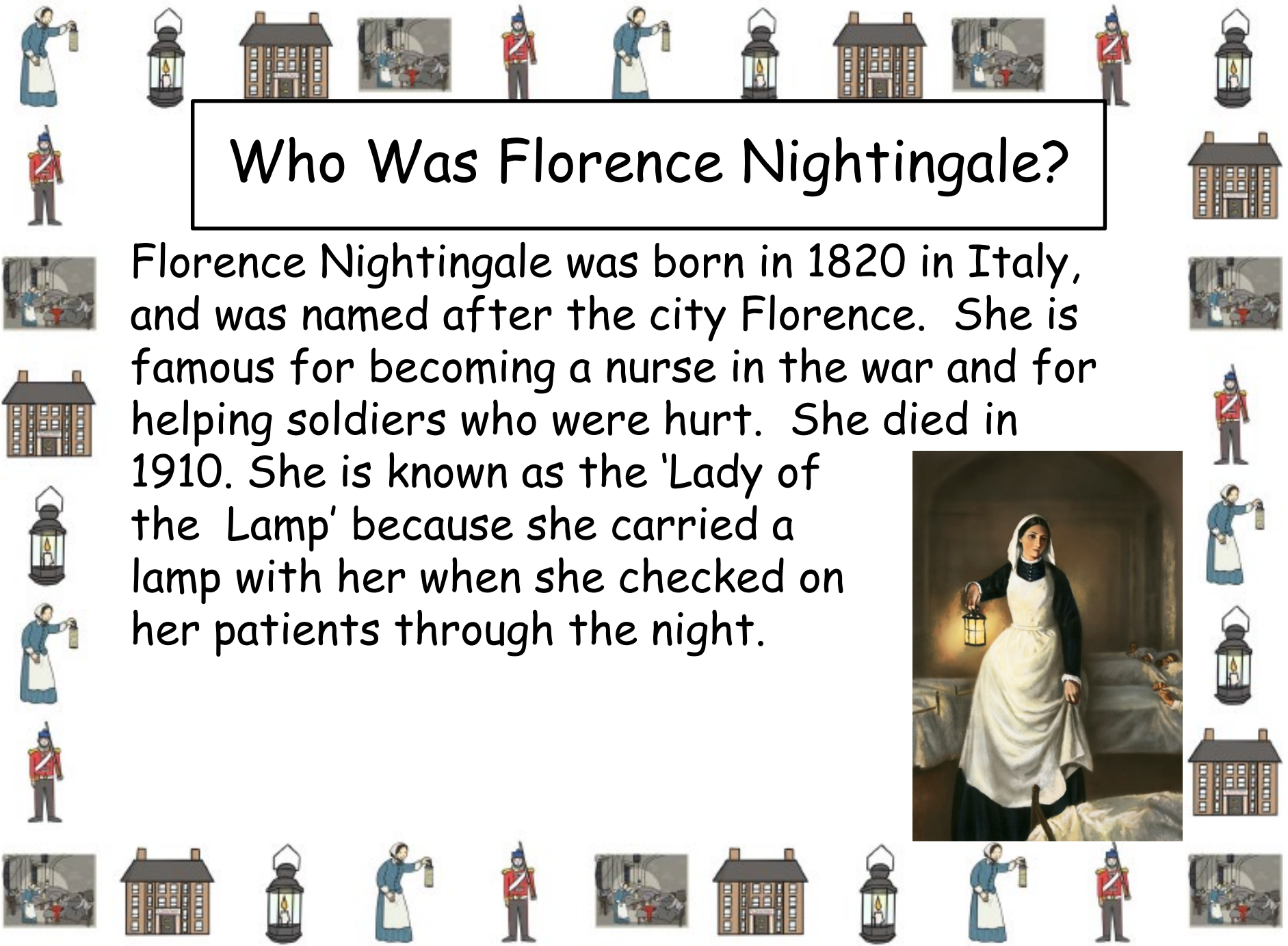

Who Was Florence Nightingale?

Florence Nightingale was born in 1820 in Italy, and was named after the city Florence. She is famous for becoming a nurse in the war and for helping soldiers who were hurt. She died in 1910. She is known as the 'Lady of the Lamp' because she carried a lamp with her when she checked on her patients through the night.



Why Is Florence Nightingale Remembered?

- She changed the way that people thought about nurses.
- She changed the way that people thought about women.
