We have seen that the sound /ee/ can be spelt in different ways.

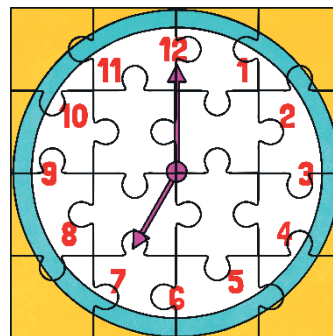
