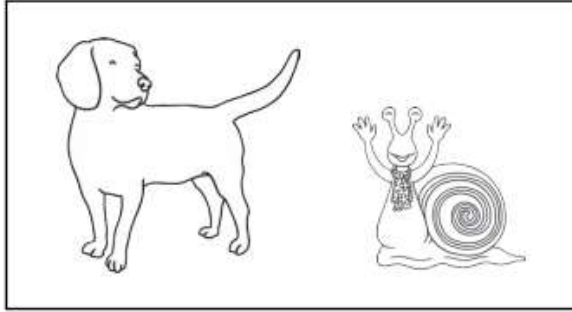

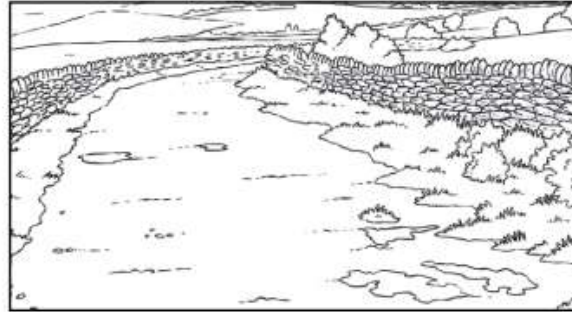

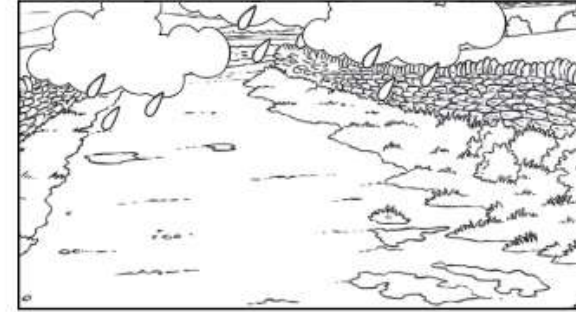
The Snail in the Rain



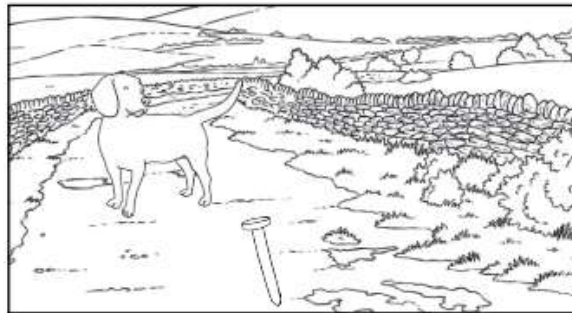
A contest was put on by the Queen, in spring. The snail and the dog with a tail, went to the start mark.



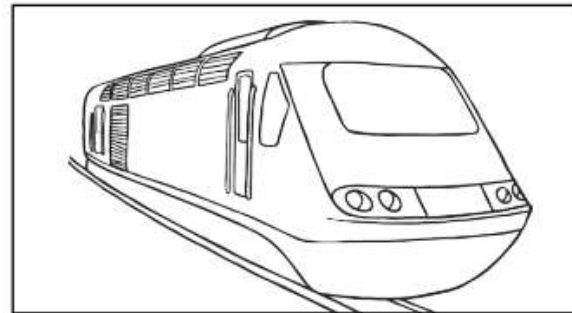
The aim was not to fail but to finish first. The main road was straight but full of bumps.

Creatures that live under water don't need to breathe.

The statement is false. Fish and most other sea creatures, breathe under water through special organs called gills.

Water is the best drink for humans and other animals.

True

The statement is true. Humans have lots of drinks to choose from, but nothing is as good for our bodies, or animal bodies, as fresh, clean water.

Humans are herbivores, they eat only plants.



False

True

The statement is false. Humans eat animals and plants. They are omnivores.

Fish never drink.

True

The statement is false. Some fish drink water, some fish get water from their food, and some absorb water through their skin.

Some creatures that live in the sea, breathe air.

The statement is true. Marine mammals, like dolphins and whales, and marine reptiles, like sea turtles, need to come to the surface of the water to breathe air, like we do.

Pets only need water, food and air to be happy and healthy.
