

Primary PE and Sport Premium: Brougham Primary School Action Plan 2018 – 19

The Department for Education has provided funding by way of the Primary PE and Sport Premium to ‘achieve self-sustaining improvement in the quality of PE and sport in primary schools. It is important to emphasise that the focus of spending must lead to long lasting impact against the vision (above) that will live on well beyond the Primary PE and Sport Premium Funding.’

Using five key indicators, it is our intention to fulfil the DFE’s vision of ALL pupils leaving primary school physically literate and with the knowledge, skills and motivation necessary to equip them for a healthy, active lifestyle and lifelong participation in physical activity and sport.
